





The City of Orange Fire Department responded to a report of a house fire Wednesday night at 2:11am in the 1400 block of Louisiana. The arriving crews found a single family residence heavily involved in fire. Three fire engines and a supervisor responded to the fire. The City of Pinehurst assisted by filling in for any additional alarms within the city. Fire crews brought the fire under control within 40 minutes. One firefighter was injured on the hand and will not be able to return to work for several days. The injured firefighter was working inside the home to extinguish the fire when a heavy glass shelf fell on his hand. The firefighter was transported to MHBO Hospital for treatment. No injuries were reported by the home owner. Fire crews remained on the scene until 5:40 extinguishing hidden fire and providing assistance to the home owner. The smoke detectors in the residence were not operational. The fire department reminds citizens to check the operation of their smoke detectors often and change the batteries each time they adjust their clocks for daylight savings time. The cause of the fire is still under investigation.



Orange Police report there have been a rash of broken windows in the area due to a person(s) using a BB gun or slingshot to break the windows. They believe the suspects are juvenile delinquents but the crime is serious and so is the amount to have these windows repaired. There is also a report of a woman being struck on the arm. A head on accident Tuesday night claimed the life of an 18 year old Orange man. Around 10pm authorities were called to FM 1130 near Stephenson Curve after David Carthel, 38, of Orange, was driving north in a 1993 white Jeep Cherokee, crossed lanes and struck a 1994 green Ford Taurus driven by 18 year old Jonathan Minchew. Both subjects had to be extricated by the Orange Fire Department. Minchew was pronounced dead at the scene by JP Joe Parkhurst. Carthel was air lifted to a Beaumont hospital with unknown injuries.



The City of Pinehurst has named the two finalist for the position of municipal court judge. They are Joy Dubose-Simonton and Joe Parkhurst. Currently Derry Dunn is filling the position on an interim basis.

Orange Police Briefs-

- -A burglary of a habitation was reported at 3757 Hemlock. Someone entered through window and rummaged through the home taking several items.
- -A burglary of a habitation at 208 10th St Apt. #24. Someone entered through a window and stole a 42" JVC TV valued at \$1500.
- -A Chevy Suburban belonging to Tom Lessard was stolen from his residence at 1204 Dawnwood. Lessard said the black Suburban was parked in his driveway when it was stolen.
- -A report of a burglary of a building at the Park Ave. Service Station. The amount of damage caused to get in the building was 10 times more than the amount taken. The suspect broke into the burglar bars in the bathroom and broke through a brick wall to enter the business. The coke machine was vandalized to steal \$30 while another \$30 in cash was taken along with a torque wrench for a total of approximately \$100.

Sunday morning around 6:15am, West Orange Police Officer Dennis Hankins was assaulted at a residence on Crabtree after responding to a disturbance. The suspect, Kenneth Comeaux, 29, left the scene with the officers gun but was caught later by Orange and Pinehurst Police. The officer was taken to a Beaumont hospital with serious head wounds but is said to be conscious and alert. Comeaux is charged with two counts of assault and the theft of an officers gun.

The Operating Board of the Toledo Bend Project Joint Operations recently approved a change to the Toledo Bend Project security plan to allow more access for fishing and recreation activities at the Toledo Bend Dam. Operations of the dam are regulated by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). The amended Toledo Bend Project security plan, which was recently approved by FERC, will: Allow boaters to operate within fifty feet of the waters edge (upstream face of Toledo Bend Dam) as opposed to the current restriction of 500 feet; Enforce a no-anchor zone from the upstream face of the dam to 1,800 feet upstream to protect critical dam safety features; Continue to restrict access to the spillway and powerhouse intake facilities with the orange cable buoys. The Toledo Bend Dam and Reservoir is a project constructed by the Sabine River Authority of Texas, and the Sabine River Authority, State of Louisiana, primarily for the purposes of water supply, hydroelectric power generation, and recreation. The Sabine River Authorities of Texas and Louisiana encourage recreational activities like boating, fishing, swimming, skiing, and hunting in all non-restricted areas around the reservoir and down the river. "We are pleased to improve the access of boaters around the dam," stated SRA-Texas Operations Manager Donnie Henson. "It is still critical to restrict access to our infrastructure which ultimately protects the general public."
