the North West quarter, of the South West quarter of Section seven, in Township Nineteen, of Range Six, in the District of Lands, subject to sale at Natchitoches Louisiana, containing thirty six acres, and forty eight hundredths of an acre

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said Isaac S. Hayes.
